ABSTRACT

WILLIAM PITT THE YOUNGER (AUGUST 2016)

William Pitt the Younger, the second son of William Pitt, earl of Chatham, and Lady Hester Grenville, daughter of Hester, Countess Temple, served as a British prime minister in the periods of 1783–1801 and 1804–06, during the French Revolution and Napoleonic wars. He is remembered for his tough policies against corruption, fiscal reform, shifting power toward the House of Commons and the union with Ireland. In the beginning of 19th century, with Napoleon planning to invade England, Pitt quickly formed a new coalition with Russia, Austria and Sweden. However, in 1805 Napoleon triumphed over the Russians and Austrians at Austerlitz and this news affected Pitt's already poor health. He died in 1806.
